The Pre-Pharmacy track at East Tennessee State University prepares students for application to a three- or four-year Doctor of Pharmacy degree program. Students may apply to some pharmacy schools after the successful completion of two years of pre-requisite undergraduate coursework. At ETSU Bill Gatton College of Pharmacy students who are admitted without a bachelor's degree will have an opportunity to complete a four-year degree while progressing in the PharmD program.

CAREERS IN PHARMACY

Pharmacists are medication experts. Therefore, you can find pharmacists working anywhere that medications are designed, studied, promoted, taught, and dispensed. While you may think of pharmacists practicing in community pharmacy settings, pharmacists also enter careers in hospitals, doctor's offices, pharmaceutical industry, federal entities (such as the Food and Drug Administration), insurance companies, compounding pharmacies, nuclear pharmacies, academia, and many other areas.

Pharmacists are routinely considered integral members of inter-professional health care teams and improve the lives of patients by managing and optimizing the medications they take. Demand is increasing for pharmacists in a variety of occupational settings including:

- academic pharmacy
- ambulatory care pharmacy
- consultant pharmacy
- federal pharmacy (military/public health setting)
- hospital and institutional pharmacy
- informatics
- · managed care pharmacy
- · pharmaceutical sciences

PRE-PHARMACY IS NOT A MAJOR. Therefore, you must choose a major (and minor, if appropriate) which supports your life goals by the time you earn 60 credit hours. Pharmacy schools are interested in students who have excelled in the sciences and mathematics, but you do not have to major in these disciplines. Choose a major/minor that you enjoy and that plays to your strengths.

It is strongly suggested you meet with your advisor and MPA counselor each semester. Students who receive scholarships or participate in specialized ETSU programs (such as athletics or Honors College programs) must also seek advisement from those departments. Serious consequences can occur if students fail to meet with appropriate advisors (e.g., failure to graduate on time, missing appropriate courses to prepare for the PCAT, etc.).

WHAT CAN I BE DOING NOW TO STRENGTHEN MY APPLICATION TO PHARMACY SCHOOL?

RELATED EXPERIENCE Students are encouraged to explore the field of pharmacy by shadowing, employment, and volunteer work. Pharmacy schools want to know that a student has worked in the field, observed what is involved, and still has the desire to continue in that profession. Quality of exposure is more important than quantity.

EXTRACURRICULARS The admissions committees of pharmacy schools are interested in seeing a range of extracurricular activities, especially those demanding a significant leadership role. Students should demonstrate their ability to balance full academic schedules with extracurricular involvement on and off campus and/or through employment opportunities. ETSU has many organizations that students can join. Students should visit ETSU's Student Activities and Organizations office or webpage (etsu.edu/students/ sao/) for more information regarding extracurricular activities. It is not beneficial to simply join an organization; you must demonstrate leadership!

VOLUNTEER EXPERIENCE Pharmacy schools are looking for candidates who express a commitment to service. Students should seek volunteer projects that focus on giving back to their community.

online etiquette Please consider personal email addresses when corresponding with professional schools. First impressions are often based on correspondence; therefore email addresses should be appropriate for professional communication. Messages and images sent electronically are reflections of judgment and potential suitability for professional careers. Inappropriate behaviors shared on an accessible venue can be viewed and shared by anyone, possibly compromising your chances of admission to a professional school.

THE APPLICATION PROCESS

Most pharmacy schools participate in the Pharmacy College Application Service (PharmCAS) at http://www.pharmacas.org. An application will be completed through this service and will then be administered to the pharmacy school(s) of your choice. Most schools require a supplemental application that will be supplied by the school.

Applications are available in July; however, application deadlines vary from November through March for each school. It is important to be aware of the deadlines and submit your applications as early as possible. During the application process, most schools will require at least two letters of recommendation, one of which should be from a pharmacist. Therefore, it is important for you to establish a strong relationship with the person(s) you are shadowing.

ETSU'S GATTON COLLEGE OF PHARMACY OFFERS SEVERAL UNIQUE OPTIONS FOR EARLY ADMISSION AND COMPLETION OF A BACHELOR'S DEGREE:

EARLY ADMISSIONS PROGRAM Gatton College of Pharmacy provides assurance of admission to the Pharm.D. program to high achieving high school students and freshmen choosing to attend ETSU. Competitive applicants will have an ACT score in the range of 25+ and a GPA in the range of 3.75+. Students must apply directly to GCOP for the Direct Admission program and must meet certain criteria to matriculate into the Pharm.D. program. https://www.etsu.edu/etsu-news/2020/04-april/three-plus-one-program.php

B.S. DEGREE IN PHARMACY STUDIES Competitive applicants may begin the Pharm.D. program as soon as they have completed at least 61 semester hours of specified undergraduate courses. After admission to GCOP, some students may elect to pursue a B.S. degree Pharmacy Studies alongside their Pharm.D. degree. Pharmacy Studies focuses on the basic sciences that underlie drugs and drug therapy and prepares students for careers in pharmacy, pharmaceutical science and research, pharmaceutical administration and sales, biotechnology, drug manufacturing, regulatory affairs, pharmaceutics, pharmacology and toxicology, dosage formulation, manufacturing quality assurance, and regulations. https://www.etsu.edu/etsu-news/2020/04-april/three-plus-one-program.php

3 + 1 PROGRAMS GCOP also offers 3 + 1 programs in Biology, Chemistry, and Health Sciences, allowing students to complete their final year of coursework in these majors while beginning their Pharm.D. degree. Upon successful completion of the required first year pharmacy courses, the student will receive a BS in their chosen major.
