

Mean temperatures for June were at to below average for most areas of the state. Almost all of West Tennessee and northeast Tennessee recorded below normal temperatures, while areas of southern East Tennessee and central Middle Tennessee recorded temperatures 0-1°F above normal for the month. The first week of the month brought above normal temperatures to most of the state, with the exception of northeast Tennessee, and northern sections of the Cumberland Plateau. A relatively strong cold front swept the state during the second week of the month, resulting in below normal temperatures, and a few record daily low temperatures on the 13th and 14th. Mount LeConte, in the Great Smoky Mountains even fell below freezing, recording a minimum temperature of 31°F on June 15th! The second half of the month was closer to normal, however most of Middle Tennessee recorded temperatures 1- 2°F above normal, driving their monthly average slightly above normal. The month ended on a warm note, with about half of the reporting weather stations reaching their monthly maximum temperatures from the 27th-30th (mostly in Middle and East Tennessee).



Monthly Precipitation Summary:

Most of the state recorded above normal precipitation during June, with a notable exception in West Tennessee, where parts of Lauderdale, Haywood, Crockett, Dyer, and Gibson Counties recorded only 50-75% normal rainfall. The rainiest part of the state was to the northeast of Nashville, in southern Sumner County, where several rain gauges recorded over a foot of rainfall during the month! Most rainfall in the state occurred during the 2nd and 3rd weeks of the month, with the first and last weeks of the month producing below normal rainfall for most of the state. Most rainfall was associated with thunderstorm activity and came in short-duration downpours. The Memphis Airport set a daily record rainfall total on the 7th, with 2.8" of rain. Nearby, on the eastern side of Shelby County, areas recorded as much as 6" of rain in a four hour period, producing record flooding on the Nonconnah Creek.





Drought Monitor:

June was a mixed bag for drought in Tennessee. Large areas of Middle Tennessee were in D0 drought conditions at the beginning of the month, but heavy rains cleared that drought. However, by the end of the month D0 conditions expanded in portions of West Tennessee, and in climate division 2 (Cumberland Plateau).





U.S. Drought Monitor Class Change - Tennessee 1 Month




Soil Moisture:


With wetter conditions this month, soil moisture averaged above 500mm across the whole state, with a small area around Shelby County observing 600mm. These soil moisture readings were at to above normal across the state, and showed an increase from the end of May.








Calculated Soil Moisture Anomaly Change JUN 30, 2019 from MAY 31



Streamflow:

Streamflow across the state also averaged at to above normal for the month. Streamflow was much above normal in northeast and southwest Tennessee. The Mississippi River re-entered flood stage for several stations in the Tennessee section of the river, including Memphis towards the end of the month. Heavy rainfall associated with thunderstorms also produced flash flooding in many areas, one of the most extreme examples occurred in the Memphis area on June 6th-7th. A thunderstorm produced 3-6 inches of rain in a 4-hour period leading to flash flooding and a record flood height on Nonconnah Creek.

Radar estimated precipitation totals and flash flooding occurred on the eastern half of Shelby County, June 6th.





Miscellaneous:

Crop Conditions from USDA: Rainfall in the middle of the month delayed harvests for winter wheat, and second plantings for soybeans; however the rainfall was beneficial to most crops and pastures which were suffering from some heat stress and soil moisture depletion from the dry conditions which occurred in May and the first week of June. By the end of the month corn, soybean, tobacco, and winter wheat crops had caught up to or surpassed 5-year average progress; cotton still remained slightly behind average progress. Topsoil moisture was rated 8% short, 73% adequate, and 19% surplus. Subsoil moisture was rated 11% short, 75% adequate, and 14% surplus. Hay and roughage supplies were rated 4% very short, 15% short, 69% adequate, and 12% surplus.

Fire Danger: The interagency fire center outlook for July indicates a lower than normal risk for wildland fires in West Tennessee, and normal risk for the rest of the state.



Story of the Month:

Several rounds of severe weather that swept the state from the 19th to the 22nd represented the major weather and climate story of the month for Tennessee. June 21st had the most reports of severe weather, and the line of storms that moved from the Ohio River in Illinois southeast all the way through South Carolina produced 4 tornadoes, 90 reports of severe wind, and 1 report of hail over 1" in Tennessee. The subsequent images and posts from the National Weather Service Nashville Forecast Office show some of the damage done by tornadoes and severe winds on the 21st.

If you live in or east of this line of storms you can expect winds up to 60-70 mph within the next 1-2 hours. This is ALL of Middle Tennessee that has not yet experienced the storms, from Jamestown to Crossville to Chattanooga and everywhere west of there. Tree damage has been extensive. Power outages are in the tens of thousands. Wait the storms out in a safe location and be prepared to lose power.

The tornado warnings have all been allowed to expire.

Our damage survey today determined an EF-1 tornado struck eastern Fentress County in the Stockton area this past Friday, June 21, 2019. Hundreds of trees were snapped and uprooted along the 3 mile long by 150 yards wide path across Stockton Road, Mt Helen Road, Chestnut Ridge Road, and Sam Smith Road, with maximum winds estimated at 90 mph. Further to the south, damage in the Clarkrange area was determined to be straight-line winds estimated up to 70 mph. A damage survey we conducted with Nashville Office of Emergency Management has determined a brief EF0 tornado struck the Stanford Estates area and Stones River Greenway in Donelson (Davidson County) this past Friday, June 21st. 
Our damage survey today also found a brief EF-1 tornado and a massive area of straight-line winds up to 85 mph struck northern Macon County this past Friday, June 21, 2019. The tornado touched down near Green Valley Road and moved eastward across Oak Knob Road and Underwood Road before lifting, blowing down hundreds of trees and damaging many barns and homes along it's 1.7 mile long by 150 yards wide path. Surrounding the tornado, an unusually large 8 mile long by 1.5 mile wide downburst with winds up to 85 mph hit the area generally from Highway 10 at the Kentucky border southeastward to along Highway 261, including the Green Valley, White Oak, Underwood, and Galen communities. This area of straight-line winds caused similar damage to the tornado, blowing down tons of trees and power lines and damaging or destroying numerous barns.



Storm Reports:

Severe weather occurred on 13 days during the month resulting in a total of 7 reports of tornadoes, 250 reports of severe wind damage, and 8 reports of hail 1" or larger.


