
# Tennessee Drought Update

### This Week's Drought Monitor of Tennessee Map



## **Statewide Condition Summary**

What's Changed? Most areas of the state saw light precipitation (rain, sleet, and freezing rain) this week and some cooler than normal temperatures this week. There were no changes in this week's drought monitor.

What's New? Although almost all areas of Tennessee had a drier than normal week there was light precipitation and surplus precipitation from January is keeping Tennessee out of drought consideration for this week's monitoring period.

What's Next? Most areas of the state will be relatively dry through the next drought monitoring period (to the upcoming Tuesday), heavier precipitation is expected to return later next week, so Tennessee will likely continue to be clear on the US Drought Monitor.


