
# Tennessee Drought Update

### This Week's Drought Monitor of Tennessee Map



## Statewide Condition Summary

What's Changed? Most areas of the state saw rain this week as well as warmer temperatures. There were no changes in this week's drought monitor.

What's New? Almost all areas of Tennessee had drier conditions with some precipitation, the rain from the previous few weeks is keeping Tennessee out of drought consideration for this week's monitoring period.

What's Next? Most areas of the state are expected to receive precipitation in the next drought monitoring period (Tuesday to Tuesday). There is a small area of concern in southwestern Tennessee that will continue to be monitored. For now Tennessee will likely continue to be clear on the US Drought Monitor.

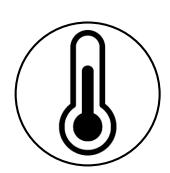
