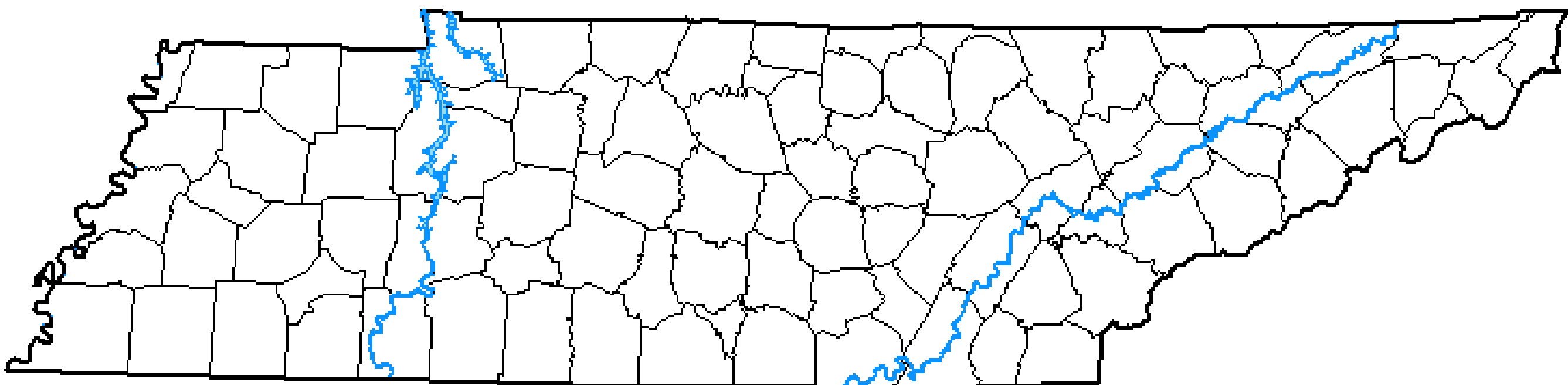


Tennessee Drought Update

For the assessment period ending April 4, 2023

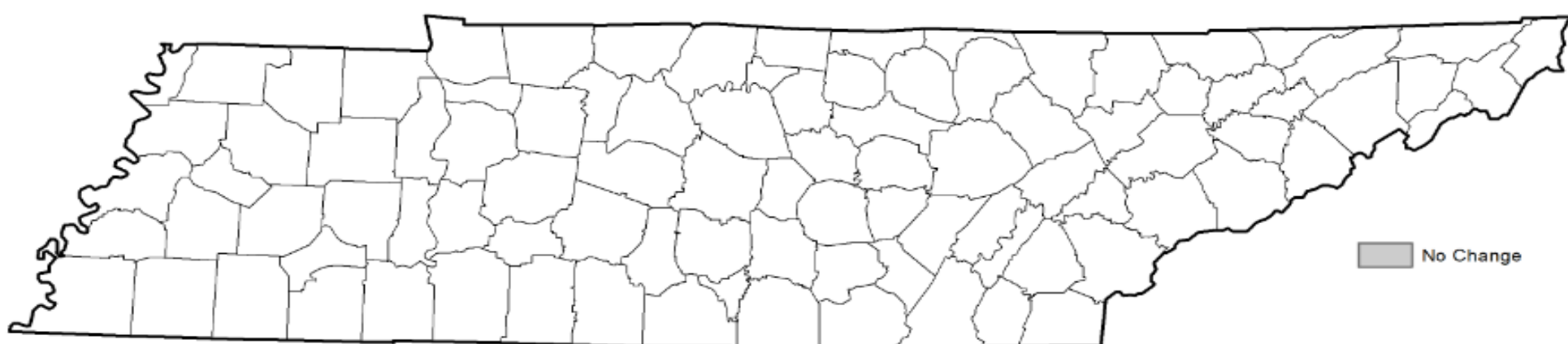
This Week's Drought Monitor of Tennessee Map

Statewide Condition Summary

What's Changed? With most areas of the state seeing rain over the last week, there were no changes in this week's drought monitor.

What's New? Almost all areas of Tennessee had some precipitation from the past week, keeping Tennessee out of drought consideration for this week's monitoring period.

What's Next? Most areas of the state are expected to receive precipitation in the next drought monitoring period (Tuesday to Tuesday). For now, Tennessee will likely continue to be clear on the US Drought Monitor.

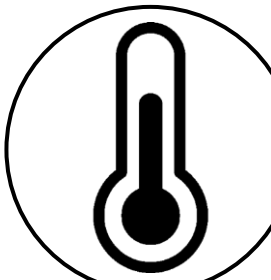

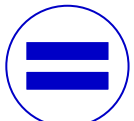
