

This Week's Drought Monitor of Tennessee Map



Statewide Condition Summary

What's Changed? With rain continuing, there were no changes in this week's drought monitor.

What's New? With more rain pushing through Tennessee there is no new drought considerations for this week's monitoring period.

What's Next? With some rain in the drought monitoring period (Tuesday to Tuesday), most parts of Tennessee will likely continue to be clear on the Drought Monitor. However, some areas of Middle and East Tennessee that have experienced persistent below average rainfall may warrant the introduction of Abnormally Dry conditions.


