

Telamon Migrant Head Start

- The Language and Culture Resource Center has been involved with Telamon through the Growing Tennessee project, a youth initiative started in 2006. Students from ETSU have participated in Growing Tennessee's Rural Youth Photography Project, as well as students from the LCRC's Migrant Education Program participating in Growing Tennessee's Alamo Mural Project. The mural is the result of a partnership between Telamon Corporation, Tennessee Arts Commission and East Tennessee State University's Migrant Education Program in Johnson City.
