Students majoring in the College of Arts and Sciences must meet the following requirements for the B.A. and B.S. degrees. Some requirements must be taken in addition to the General Education Core (Gen. Ed. Core), whereas others specify which courses from the Gen. Ed. Core must be taken.

### Graduation Application:

### Major Field Tests:

**Sociology majors** are required to take a Major Field Test (*Sociology Senior Exit Exam*) prior to graduation. The exam is coordinated and administered by Sociology faculty usually during a student's final semester.

**Anthropology majors** are required to take a Major Field Test (*Anthropology Exit Exam*) prior to graduation. Anthropology majors complete the exam in ANTH 4830 Anthropological Theory.
