The Online Degree Program requires completion of 36 semester credit hours, two courses per semester over two academic years, including two courses each summer.

ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS

Each applicant to the graduate program in Early Childhood Education must complete the following:

- Complete all the requirements for admission to the School of Graduate Studies.
- Present a minimum of a 3.0 undergraduate grade point average or complete a probationary period in which the student achieves a grade point average of 3.0 and no grade lower than a B in the first 9 credits of graduate credit.
- 3. Be reviewed by the Early Childhood Admissions committee. Those who do not have an undergraduate degree in early childhood education or a related field of study may be required to take selected undergraduate courses that will strengthen the applicant's background in early childhood education.
