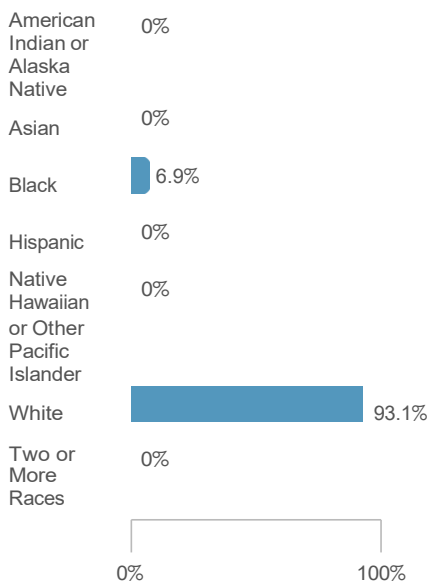

This metric indicates the number of cohort members the provider had in each of the three years represented in the Report Card.

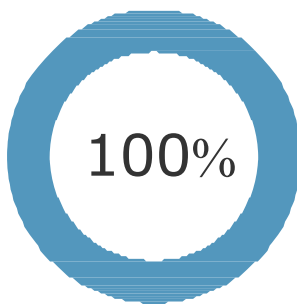
Completers by Race

Praxis Leader Licensure Pass Rate

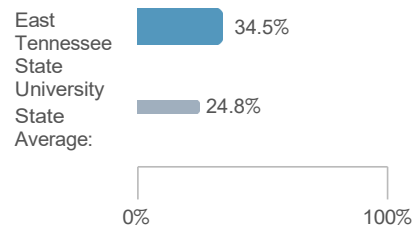
