


- Major Giving:

- -- College of Business & Technology Director of Development update position has been filled and Mona Salyer most recently of King University joined our staff in January 2018.
- -- All Advancement staff attended 3-day training in December focused on "Managing the Capital Campaign." The Lilly Family School of Philanthropy from Indiana University again instructed.

- Advancement Services:


- -- Completed wealth screening against our current database contacts; now prioritizing and assigning.
- -- Completed Voluntary Support for Education external benchmarking report.
- -- Developed script for creating recurring annual pledges; added imaging security for gift entry.
- **WETS-FM** winter fundraiser was very successful online gift volume was up 34% over last December.
- **Annual Giving** conducted first "Thankathon," placing 4,000 thank you calls to donors; also called 2,000 households to gauge interest in planned gifts; new Facebook page at www.facebook.com/etsugiving.
- Planned Giving booked \$1.9M in commitments this quarter.
 - -- Strong focus on wills/bequests (5% for the Future launched in Nov); donor meetings scheduled for 2018; multiple planned gifts have been cultivated and we expect them to be committed this fiscal year.
- **Alumni Association** many student-focused activities this qtr, with more Student Alumni Assoc. events.
- -- Transitioned football efforts to build on GAME DAY; three away game events at JMU, Furman, & W. Car.
- -- HOMECOMING 2017 back on campus; plus partnership with President's Circle Tailgates.
- Athletics Scott Carter named Athletic Director 10/15; Randy Sanders named football coach 12/17.
 - -- Inaugural season completed in Greene Stadium over 48,000 people welcomed to campus.
 - -- Brooks Gym and Football fieldhouse improvement projects continue as part of Embrace Excellence.

College of Clinical and Rehabilitative Health Sciences

Doubled annual gifts in 2016-17, increasing by more than \$11K over 2015-16

- Created a scholarship for Speech-Language Pathology in memory and honor of the first graduating class ('55)
- New Audiology Clinic will open its doors in January 2018, at the Nave Center in Elizabethton
- Director of Development has made over 50 visits to alumni and community supporters, so far in 2017-18

College of Nursing

Increased total giving to the College by 44% from 2015-16 to 2016-17; annual gifts are up nearly 50%

- Received several large gifts toward new scholarships for nursing students
- The nurse-led clinic known as The Downtown Day Center underwent a million-dollar renovation and will open its doors in January 2018. This clinic serves the homeless population in Johnson City, Tennessee
- Director of Development has made over 50 visits to alumni and community supporters, so far in 2017-18

Bill Gatton College of Pharmacy

Increased Philanthropic Cash by more than 22% so far this fiscal year

- A recent economic impact study conservatively estimates the presence of the College of Pharmacy contributes over \$36M per year to the Tennessee economy and has led to the creation of 373 jobs.
- Established an Alumni Engagement Taskforce to assist with alumni participation in fundraising.
- Conducted 80 visits with donors, prospective donors, alumni, and friends, so far in 2017-18.
- 51 alumni attended events hosted by the college on-campus and at national conferences.

College of Public Health

Increased Philanthropic Cash by more than 45% so far in 2017-18

- Received a generous gift from a foundation to provide scholarships for Master of Public Health students.
- Conducted 102 visits with donors, prospective donors, alumni, and retirees since the start of the fiscal year.
- 68 alumni attended events hosted by the college on-campus and at state and national conferences.
