- Major Giving

• We have recently hired a second Director of Development for the College of Business and Technology. Javonte' Ashford will start on June 3. Javonte' has a background in student recruitment and administration with two different private colleges, and we feel he is going to be a fantastic fundraiser. Once he joins the team, we will employ 11 Directors of Development and fourteen fundraisers overall.

- Advancement Services

- Improved efficiency for processing December gifts; prepared & sent annual receipts for recurring gifts.
- Continued to make database updates from PCI Alumni Directory responses.
- Prepared files for the Distinguished President's Trust to be shared across partner organizations.
- Completed 2 peer benchmarking surveys including the fundraising portion of AAMC report for QCOM.

- Annual Giving

- Raised just over \$1M so far in 2018-19 up 4% over the previous year.
- Conducting a limited test of a peer-to-peer texting service to possibly improve communication.
- During Day of Giving, April 17-18, we hope to have at least 350 donors help open doors for Buccaneer students. Give and advocate at www.etsu.edu/give.

- Planned Giving

- Planned gifts booked this fiscal year exceed \$6M.
- Record number of new inductees (12) into the Legacy Circle (those who made planned gifts to ETSU).

- Alumni Association


- Held Southern Conference basketball pregame events for alumni & fans.

Student Life and Enrollment & Roan Scholars

The Division of Student Affairs is now the Division of Student Life and Enrollment.

- New division now includes the Scholarship Office, Undergraduate Admissions, Veterans Affairs, and Trio.
- Associate Vice President testified at the US Senate Committee on Health Education, Labor, and Pensions hearing on campus safety, student rights, and sexual misconduct issues.
- The Roan Scholars Leadership Program recently received two five-figure gifts.
- Roan Scholars traveled to Atlanta, GA and Washington DC to participate in leadership building experiences.
- The National Pan-Hellenic Council Plaza kick off celebration was held with several lead donations including a \$5,000 gift from CITI Commerce Solutions in Gray.

University Programs

The director of development made over 110 visits to date to generate support from alumni and friends of ETSU.

- School of Graduate Studies welcomed new dean, Dr. Sharon James McGee, in August 2018.
- School of Continuing Studies & Academic Outreach adding several new programs at the Sevierville campus Fall '19.
- Sherrod Library welcomed new dean, David P. Atkins, in January 2019.
- Honors College established new scholarships in the areas of International Programs, Honors in Discipline Program, and Undergraduate Research.

WETS-FM

Emphasis on Sustaining Memberships resulted in steady support; on track to exceed last year's donations.
