- Major Giving:

- All directors of development have surpassed their target amounts for dollars raised over the entire previous fiscal year and there are still three months remaining in the current fiscal year!
- During the 3rd quarter, we received major gifts to benefit the Mary B. Martin Arts Center, the Bluegrass program, the Quillen College of Medicine, the College of Public Health, the Clemmer College of Education, and numerous scholarships to benefit ETSU students.
- **Advancement Services** compiled data to study the feasibility of a major fundraising campaign.
 - Held two training sessions for directors of development to better use our wealth screening tool.
 - Prepared and delivered yearly giving statements for all donors of recurring gifts.
 - Updated addresses, employment information, and other biographical data from various services.
- **Annual Giving** total funds raised as of March 31, 2018 is \$936K, which is 23% above this time last year.
 - Sites for crowdfunding and online employee payroll deduction were brought on-line this quarter.
 - Updated online giving forms are nearly complete and will be activated early in the next quarter.
- **Planned Giving** booked \$3.4 million in pledges this quarter; conducted 10 quality donor visits.
 - Hosted a seminar presented by two Johnson City attorneys on the topics of estate planning and probate.
 - Developed new system for personally recognizing all Legacy Circle members with birthday cards.


- Alumni Association:

ETSU Foundation Balance


The total fund balance as of March 31, 2018 is \$97,918,578.

Athletics

Over the past year, Embrace Excellence initiatives have raised over \$6 million for Athletics projects.

2nd Annual "Legacy Day" was held April 11, 2018.

- Embrace Excellence Initiatives update: indoor tennis courts refinished inside the Dome; new chair back and bleacher system installed, acoustic solutions added, and painted in Brooks Gym; renovated several locker rooms; added new LVT flooring in the Jerry Robertson BucSports Athletic Medicine Center; and painted the lower level west side of Dome. Flat screen TVs, graphics, and digital signage in the Dome to follow soon.
- Women's basketball team earned bid to NIT (4th such appearance); Coach Ezell notched her 250th career victory.
- Football team completed spring practice under first-year Coach Sanders in the Ballad Health Blue & Gold Game.

Student Affairs

Student Affairs outright cash & securities have increased 76% over last FY. Roan increased over 23%

- Established a framework/timeline for Senior Class Gift program; regalia cords at Commencement for student donors.
- Identified Culp Center renovation/expansion opportunities for partnership with Student Affairs.
- Roan Scholar alumni giving rate continues to lead the university with over 90% participation, year over year.
- The Roan launched a restructured communications plan with redesigned website and routine email communication intended to increase donor communication and interest.

University Programs

Relationship-building activities for University Programs is up overall, with over a 200% increase in visits with constituents so far this year

- **School of Continuing Studies and Academic Outreach**. Finalizing a large foundation gift endowment for scholarships to help ETSU Kingsport students complete their degrees.
- School of Graduate Studies. Established new graduate student scholarship for books and materials.
- Sherrod Library. Hosted popular friend raising events, including Tables of Content and Celebration of ETSU Authors.
- **Honors College**. Established new endowment for honors student scholarships, as well as new scholarships for Presidential Honors Community Service Scholars, Undergraduate Research, and Fine and Performing Arts Scholars.

WETS-FM

Sustaining Memberships Reflect Steady Support for WETS-FM

- Public radio station WETS-FM conducted no fundraising events during the third quarter of FY 2018, yet the station saw the addition of over \$25K to its coffers. On the fiscal year, we've raised nearly \$180K.
- The Spring Drive kicks off on April 18th with an online-only drive, followed by our call-in drive through April 27th.
- For the past five years, we have encouraged supporters to become "sustaining members" to automatically give monthly versus one-time gifts. The result has been greater total contributions and improved member retention.
