#### Major Giving

♦ Due to the Covid-19 crisis, our team of fundraisers are working from home, just as the majority of campus employees. Their focus is to contact donors and prospects to check on their wellness and inform them about how ETSU is handling various aspects of the situation, including the many ways the university is helping our community cope with the emergency.

#### Advancement Services

- ♦ Contracted with new research firm who integrates with Gravyty for enhanced major gift communications
- ♦ Completed a full set of Major Gift dashboards for DoDs and management
- ♦ Processed annual receipts for recurring gift donors & completed prep work for DPT
- ♦ Moved full time operation to remote processing with two employees in the office 2 days a week

### Annual Giving

- ♦ Day of Giving was cancelled due to COVID-19, but we were able to pivot to support Bucs Help Bucs.
- ♦ On track for the best year on record for student giving until the crisis; mailed students their Giving Cords.
- ♦ Remaining unit-level direct mail solicitations were placed on hold.

#### Planned Giving

- ♦ We have applied to the State of TN to issue Charitable Gift Annuities to provide an additional option for those who want to support the ETSU mission.

- ♦ The future is still bright; let's plan together, to fulfill that promise.


#### Alumni Association



# **Unit Reports**

## **Athletics**

- 2019-20 ETSU Athletics Total Attendance: 154,758 in shortened athletics year. 8,404 more attendees than the entire 2018-19 athletics year.
- 2019-20 ETSU Athletics Ticket Revenue: \$1,283,911 in shortened athletics year. \$92,798 more than the entire 2018-19 athletics year.
- As of April 10: 2019-20 ETSU Athletics Foundation Revenue: \$1,330,758. This is \$71,653 ahead of 2018-19 fiscal year to date.
- ETSU Men's Basketball wins 2020 Southern Conference Championship in front of national TV audience on ESPN.

## **Student Life & Enrollment**

- Supported the students' transition to online classes through housing, food service, counseling, providing financial assistance through the Buccaneer Crisis Fund, and addressing food insecurity through Bucky's Food Pantry.
- A "Grand Re-Opening" was held for the newly renovated D.P. Culp Student Center.
- ETSU hosted the second annual "Festival of Ideas."
- ETSU students elected new Student Government Association representatives.

## **University Programs**

- The Honors College welcomed Dean Christopher Keller last summer who has already established several new experiential learning programs for our students. New study abroad funds have been established in order to support these programs and more opportunities of support have been created as well."
- The Sherrod Library is partnering with other colleges on campus to establish a new Music Library, to build collections that support the ETSU research and service mission, and to obtain virtual reality and online anatomy and chemistry models to support student research.

## **WETS-FM**

• The spring fundraising campaign for WETS-FM/HD was cancelled due to the Coronavirus emergency. The station conducted an online-only campaign, which brought in \$63,490. However, the Corporation for Public Broadcasting announced that public radio and television stations will receive at least \$75,000 in additional funding through the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act which was signed into law on March 27, 2020.
