Research Training

As a reminder for all investigators and study staff, the ETSU IRB requires completion of research training through the CITI online training platform. Training must be completed prior to the IRB approval of any new studies. CITI training expires every 3 years and must be renewed as long as a researcher is study staff on an active IRB study. Request for IRBManager Access

The ETSU IRB uses the online submission system IRBManager for review and approval of research applications. Individuals wanting to submit research to the IRB need to request access.
