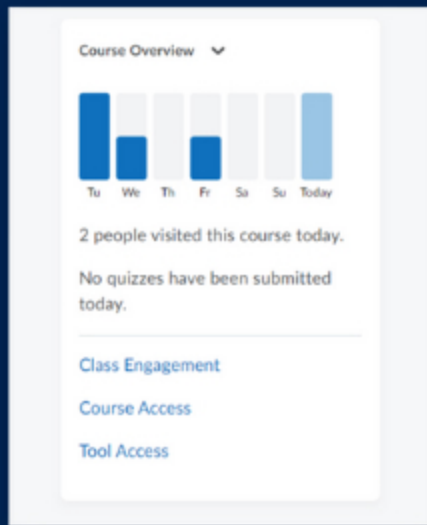


HOW TO ENABLE AND USE THE INSIGHTS WIDGET

Visualize student data on engagement and performance

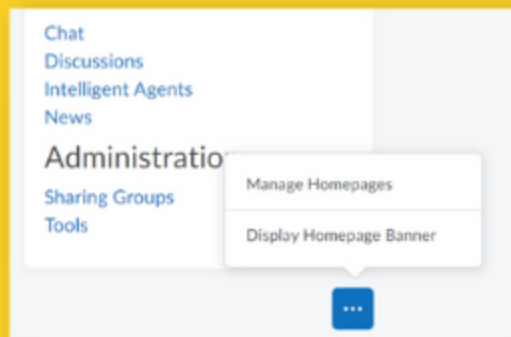


Course Overview

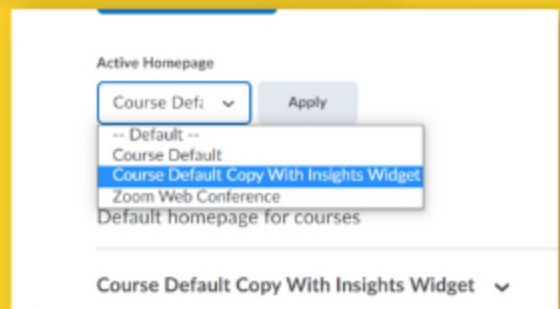
- Shows activity in the course for one week.
- Contains details about number and type of activities.
- Includes links to more detailed data in Class Engagement, Course Access, and Tool Access.

How to Enable Insights Widget:

On the bottom right of the course homepage, click the three dots and select “Manage Homepages.”



In the “Active Homepage” dropdown menu, select “Course Default Copy with Insights Widget.”



Click Apply.



Course Access/Time Visited: Students who spend little to no time on the course and material are less likely to have completed readings, assessments, or discussions housed within the LMS.

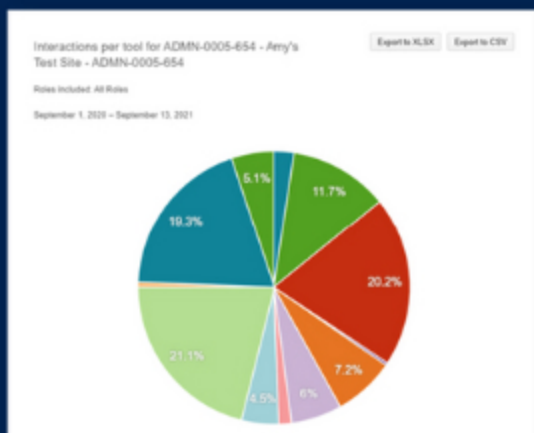
If students are not logging in regularly or are not staying logged in for more than a minute, check in to see why. It may be worth offering readings or assessments in alternate forms, if possible.

Tool Access: Allows you to see which tools are not being used and determine if, for example, fewer students are completing discussions—find out why!

Often, students look only at their to-do list of assignment due dates. Be sure to give clear directions on where to access materials (Content, Discussions, Assessments, Dropbox).

Class Engagement: Look at individual student reports to figure out why grades are low.

It’s helpful to look at whole-class patterns to determine what might be missing many of your learners, but it’s also valuable to look at individual student reports to help with remediation or offer one-on-one support.
