

## OTHER WAYS TO MEET DEFICIENCIES

### DEPARTMENTAL EXAMINATIONS

Eligible students may establish advanced standing through approved examination programs and educational experiences. Comprehensive departmental examinations are available in the college level courses listed on the next page. There are no departmental exams for the English, Algebra, and Advanced Math/Geometry areas.

### COLLEGE LEVEL EXAMINATION PROGRAM

Advanced standing through the College Level Examination Program (CLEP) may count toward meeting high school unit deficiencies in the following areas:

## MEETING HIGH SCHOOL UNIT DEFICIENCIES

### GENERAL INFORMATION

The completion of certain high school units as an admission requirement for Tennessee Board of Regents (TBR) universities began in the Fall of 1989. The Visual/Performing Arts requirement began in the Fall of 1993. Information can be secured from the Office of Admissions. These requirements affect new freshmen and transfer students.

### ADMISSION STATUS-HIGH SCHOOL UNIT REQUIREMENTS

First-time freshmen and transfer students will be notified of any deficiencies by email. Students admitted to the university who are required to complete unit deficiencies will receive information about registration for the appropriate term. Once students register for classes, their progress toward meeting these deficiencies will be monitored by the Office of the Registrar.

### TIME FRAME

Students will be required to take the necessary courses for meeting their high school unit deficiencies prior to reaching junior standing (60 earned credit hours). However, students are **strongly** encouraged to take the necessary course(s) to remove deficiencies during their first year.

### GRADE REQUIREMENTS

Students must earn a grade of "D" or better in all college level courses taken to remove unit deficiencies.

**NOTE:** Some departments may require a "C" or better as a prerequisite to other courses.

### COURSES MEETING UNIT DEFICIENCIES

The chart on the following page provides a concise listing of the courses which, when completed, will remove the unit deficiencies. Most of the courses which will remove deficiencies will also satisfy general education core requirements.

## HIGH SCHOOL UNIT

DEFICIENCY IN:REMOVE DEFICIENCY BY TAKING:

Course placement is based on ACT or SAT scores. If no valid scores exist (scores within 3 years), arrangements to take COMPASS exam should be made as soon as possible. Contact the University Advisement Center (in the ARC) for details at (423) 439-5244. Advising and registration can be considered only after this test is completed. Based upon test results, appropriate course(s) will be prescribed.
