COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This one-semester course is required for graduation in Tennessee. As described on the Tennessee Department of Education Website, "Personal Finance is a foundational course designed to inform students how individual choices directly influence occupational goals, future earning potential, and long term financial well-being. The standards in this course cover decision-making skills related to goal setting, earning potential, budgeting, saving, borrowing, managing risk, and investing." We will also address other life skills such as resume writing, college essays, and business and personal letters.

Categories and Grading Scale
